



Montana Offender Tracking & Notification System UPDATE— May 2009

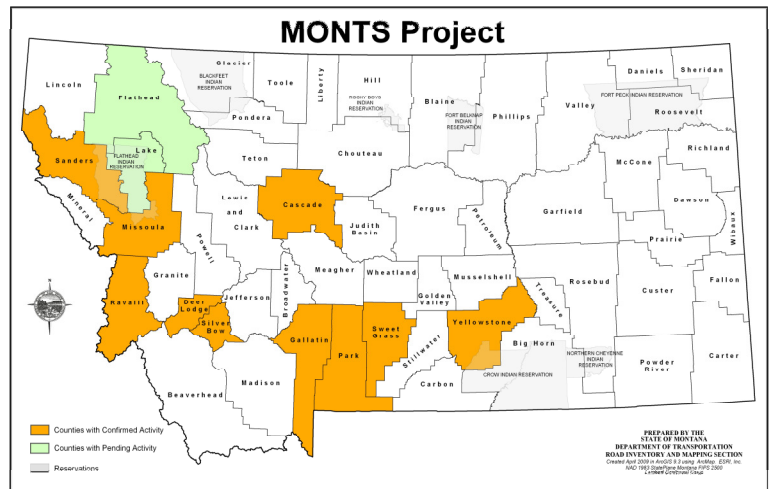
Noteworthy Events:

- * We were able to assist authorities in Ravalli County by providing confirmation that one offender was not capable of participating in recent criminal activity through data obtained from the electronic monitoring device.
- * We are continuing to seek out partnerships in all areas of the state and are especially looking for respondents in the eastern portion of Montana.

For the month of May the MONTS Project through its partnership with AquilaVision, the MSPDA and Invezeon has more than 50 electronic Monitoring Units up and running with over 900 + days of offender tracking in nine different counties. These GPS tracking units are being used in a variety of governmental agencies for monitoring: sex offenders, youths, prison inmates, veterans, parolees and in DUI Cases.

The project continues to increase awareness throughout Montana for electronic monitoring offender tracking in more ways than just direct cash allotments.

AquilaVision's customer support was able to give confirmation to the county attorney, and the detention center, that a known arsonist was not involved in a fire in one of the counties, which eliminated time of officers to investigate that particular person because he was being monitored by one of the MONTS GPS tracking units.



Invezeon is moving along forcefully with its scope of work and will be presenting a demonstration of CHAIN's capability of alerting multiple users on multiple devices automatically. As the legislature closed its doors our project continued to seek out additional partnerships throughout Montana and is looking forward to working even more with social service agencies, the Montana Department of Transportation, the Montana DUI Task Force, public defenders, county attorneys and law enforcement to make Montana a safer place. In addition, we are hopeful that we will be able to assist with several of the interim study sessions based on information contained in those pieces of legislation.
